General Conditions of the Canterbury Agricultural & Pastoral Association

To be read in conjunction with Section Conditions and with the Rules and By-Laws of the Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand.

PRIVACY ACT

The Association holds records of names and addresses of all Members and Exhibitors and may publish these for the purposes of Show media reports or promotional purposes at the Association's discretion. The Association may take photographs and video images of Members, Exhibitors, exhibits (including livestock) and the employees, agents and assistants of any Exhibitor and use this information for reporting or promotional purposes in any media, at the Association's discretion.

IMPORTANT HEALTH & SAFETY INFORMATION FOR EXHIBITORS AND COMPETITORS

All Exhibitors agree to comply with the Terms of the Health & Safety Act 1992 and its subsequent amendments. The Canterbury A&P Association hereby states that it will accept no responsibility in any claim from any person resulting from non-compliance with the Act.

Livestock Exhibitors and Competitors must follow the instructions of Marshals and Officials. Exhibitors and competitors are responsible for ensuring animals are kept in control at all times.

The Canterbury A&P Association reserves the right to order immediate removal from the Showgrounds of any animal it considers dangerous, unruly or unmanageable.

Livestock Exhibitors must ensure that they keep walkways clear and no dangerous equipment or chemicals are accessible to the public. In any livestock parade children aged under 12 years leading cattle are to be accompanied by an adult. Any animal 2 years or over must be led by a person aged 16 years and over.

There is to be NO SMOKING in the Horseboxes, Cattle Marquee or Livestock Pavilion. Any person found smoking within these areas will be fined \$ 500. Livestock and Machinery Exhibitors are reminded that no exhibits shall be removed from the Showground until after 5.30pm.

Protective Headgear - Wearing a hard hat is compulsory for anyone competing on, working in or schooling or riding for any reason a horse within the Showgrounds.

First Aid: First aid stations are located by the Main Arena, Show Office and the Isaac Arena. Please familiarise yourself with the Showgrounds site map.

Accidents must be reported to your Section Office or the Show Office.

SMOKING

Smoking is prohibited in all Livestock Pavilions, Marquees and Horseboxes. The Canterbury A&P Committee reserves the right to impose a fine of \$500 on any person found smoking within these areas.

ENTRIES

Entries must be accompanied by total entry fees payable and be in the hands of the Show Secretary on or before the closing dates advertised in the Schedule.

All entries must be made in the name of the bona-fide owner of the exhibits hereinafter called the Exhibitor, and such exhibits must have been the property of the Exhibitor at the time of entry. Registered Lessees of animals are permitted to enter under their own name.

Exhibitors must state as accurately as possible at the time of entry the date of birth of all stock in classes where the age is required.

Times by which exhibits are required to be in their allotted places on the Showgrounds ready for judging are detailed at the head of each Section.

Exhibitors must provide sufficient attendants to take charge of each entry of Cattle, Horse, and Sheep entered in Breeder's Groups, and lead them into the Show Ring when required. Exhibitors failing to comply with this regulation will be liable to forfeit their prizes at the discretion of the Canterbury A&P Committee. No one under the age of 16 can lead a large animal.

No animal from a herd or farm under movement control for TB or Brucellosis or distance control place notice, and cattle awaiting a comparative cervical test result, and any replacement stock associated with such animals shall be exhibited at the Show.

The Canterbury A&P Association shall not be responsible for any loss or damage caused (inter alia) through disease or infection however arising. Each Exhibitor shall have deemed to have guaranteed to the Canterbury A&P Association and have given warranty that each exhibit entered and brought to the Showgrounds is free of any contagious or infectious disease.

Machinery Exhibitors are reminded that compliance with the terms of the Health & Safety in Employment Act 1992 and its subsequent amendments is the responsibility of the Exhibitor and that the Canterbury A&P Association hereby states that it will accept no responsibility in any claim from any person resulting from non-compliance with the Act. Exhibitors of machinery and mechanical equipment of any description must ensure that it is fully guarded to be incapable of injuring spectators or Exhibitors while on display. Tractors and other machinery demonstrated at work must be attended by a member of the Exhibitor's staff while working, and must be efficiently immobilised when not working. Exhibits which are considered by the Canterbury A&P Committee to be dangerous, to be excessively noisy, or undesirable in any other way, may be immobilised at the discretion of the Canterbury A&P Committee.

Machinery Exhibitors are reminded that no machinery or displays shall be removed from the Showgrounds until after 5.30pm on the last day of the Show. Failure to comply with this condition automatically disqualifies the offender from future Shows.

Entry fee, ferry and camping concessions for North and Southland exhibitors only apply at time of entry. No refunds after the Show.

Pen fees are to cover the cost of straw removal and disposal after completion of the Show.

RIGHTS OF THE CANTERBURY A&P COMMITTEE

The Canterbury A&P Committee reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry without adducing any reason for so doing and reserves the right to make any alteration to The Show timetable, or withdraw any event as may be deemed desirable. Any unruly or dangerous animal or exhibit may be required to leave the Showgrounds.

PROTESTS

All protests must be in writing, and may be lodged with the President of the Canterbury A&P Association within ONE HOUR from the completion of the class judged, together with a deposit of \$50, which shall be returned should the protest be sustained. Should the protest be lodged before the Judges proceed to their duties, the onus of proof will rest with the Exhibitor; if after that, the onus of proof will be with the party protesting. No protest will be received later than one hour after the prize tickets are affixed. The Canterbury A&P Committee, or not less than five members thereof, will decide all protests as soon as practicable, and there shall be no appeal from their decision.

CATALOGUE

When an animal has been duly entered and catalogued in any class, the substitution of another animal will not be permitted without the consent of the Canterbury A&P Committee. Please see relevant section conditions for any replacement animal. Exhibits competing in the Family and Group Classes are also eligible for other classes.

No animals, excepting those entered in the Catalogue or as part of a Trade Display, will be allowed on the Showgrounds.

PRIZES, PRIZE MONEY, SPONSORSHIPS

Note that by entering into this confirmation we take this as acceptance that you understand that any prize money paid by CAPA to you, may depending on the amount and your individual circumstances, be regarded as income by the Inland Revenue in New Zealand and therefore subject to the payment of income tax. It is your responsibility to take independent advice on this and to make such payment where required. CAPA accepts no responsibility for the payment of any income tax obligations that may or may not arise from the payment of any such prize money to you. In the event of there being no competition (i.e. one exhibit) in any Class, no prize will be given unless the Judge certifies to particular merit.

Judges of Stock, in arriving at their decision, are requested not to give undue weight to high condition, but to award the prizes to the animals in each Class which they consider best represent the particular breed or description intended to be encouraged. The Judges are requested to pass over all animals whose want of condition betokens weakness of constitution, however great their merit may be in other respects.

In each class of Livestock cash prizes are offered, but Judges are requested not to award them if the exhibits are not up to standard.

In all cases where two or three prizes have been awarded the Judges are requested to 'very highly commend' any of the other exhibits worthy of this distinction.

Any dispute arising out of the allotment of the Private Prizes may be settled by the Canterbury A&P Committee at their next meeting after the Show, and their decision shall be final.

All prize money will be paid by direct credit after the Show except Canterbury Youth Show classes. Prize money for these classes will be paid in cash at the Show. Shearing prize money will be paid at the Show.

Class sponsorship monies, subject to confirmation, will be paid IN LIEU of Association prize money, although Breed Society special cash prize monies will be additional. The Association takes no responsibility for sponsorships which do not eventuate.

AWARDS - PRIZE CARDS, CUPS & TROPHIES

Distinguishing Colours of Ribbons: First to Sixth prize-takers in Horse and Pony Sections will carry a coloured Ribbon 1st to 6th as follows - Red, Blue, Yellow, Green, Orange, White. Supreme - Red/Black/Red, Champion - Blue, Reserve - Purple, Special Prize - Burgundy, Bottle Green.

SCALE OF POINTS, with the exception of Milk Classes in the Dairy Section, where there are five entries or more.

In the event of a tie the winner of the largest number of First Prizes shall have preference. In the event of no competition, only half points awarded. Competition means two or more Exhibitors, whose exhibits are judged competing for prizes in a particular class.

Collection of Trophies: Trophies are available from the Secretary's Office after they have been engraved. An email will go out to all recipients informing of pick up days and times. No trophies will be engraved at the Show this year.

LIVESTOCK BREED DISPLAYS

The Canterbury A&P Association will make an award to the best presented Breed Display throughout the Show following recommendations made by Chairmen of the Livestock Sections. Judging will be convened by the Chairman of the Machinery Section and assisted by the Second Vice-President and a co-opted Past President.

STUD CLASSES

THE LEONARD WHITE SILVER CHALLENGE SHIELD Most points in the Stud Classes.

THE D D MACFARLANE PERPETUAL CHALLENGE SHIELD Given by the late Leonard White, for most points in the following Sections in turn: Clydesdale Horses, Shorthorn Cattle and Corriedale Sheep.

PARKING STOCK TRUCKS AND HORSE FLOATS

Horse Floats for stable unloading and Stock Trucks are to enter Canterbury Agricultural Park from the gate on Curletts Road only. Horse Floats with no stable or camping booked enter from the gate on McMahon Drive. Parking for all Stock Trucks and Horse Floats is available on the grounds in designated areas with marshals ensuring that parking is available for all Exhibitors. Parking is entirely at the vehicle owner's risk.

Any vehicles parked will be on condition that the Canterbury A&P Association accepts no responsibility for any loss, theft, injury or damage to persons or vehicles, their contents, fittings or accessories even when such loss, theft, injury or damage is attributed to any negligence on the part of the Canterbury A&P Association or any of its employees or stewards.

The Canterbury A&P Committee reserves the right to remove any motor vehicle, float, caravan or any other form of trailer which is parked in any area or manner other than those prescribed by Canterbury A&P Committee without prior notice. **ANY VEHICLE FOUND TO BE PARKED INSIDE THE SHOWGROUNDS WITHOUT AUTHORITY, WILL BE TOWED AWAY AT OWNER'S EXPENSE. ANY VEHICLE FOUND TO BE PARKED INSIDE THE SHOWGROUNDS WITHOUT AUTHORITY, WILL BE TOWED AWAY AT OWNER'S EXPENSE.**

TIMETABLE

All Times Subject to Change

Exhibitors are asked to check times in Catalogue, and must be ready to enter the ring at start time. The timetable may be affected by number of entries received.

GENERAL

All persons admitted into any premises controlled by the Canterbury A&P Association shall be subject to the orders of the Canterbury A&P Committee, and in the event of misbehaviour on the part of anyone attending the Show, such person may be removed by order of the President or any two members of the Canterbury A&P Committee. Any exhibitor who interferes with or abuses a Judge or Officer of the Canterbury A&P Association whilst acting in his official capacity as such, will be dealt with as may be deemed fitting by the Judicial Committee, and Stewards are instructed to report such occurrences promptly. The President or any two members of the Canterbury A&P Committee may eject from the Showgrounds, without compensation or return of fees, any person whose conduct, either personal or as proprietor of a side show or exhibit, is a source of annoyance.

Any Exhibitor who behaves in a manner which, in the opinion of the Judges or the Canterbury A&P Committee, does or is likely to embarrass or is intended to embarrass the Canterbury A&P Committee, the Judges or the sponsors of the event, or which is likely to have effect of bringing the event into discredit, or which is behaviour which the Judges of the event or the Canterbury A&P Committee (or not less than any two members of the Canterbury A&P Committee) consider in their opinion to be rude, bad manners, disobedient or abusive or which is designed to or has the effect of harassing or being discourteous to any Steward, Judge or other official, may be censured, expelled, fined or banned by the Judicial Committee constituted under Clause 37.

No person shall supply, provide, sell, give or dispose of any food, drink, or any other form of refreshment or tobacco to any other person on the land of the Canterbury A&P Association during an Agricultural and Pastoral Show held by the Association without the written permission of the Show Management.

The privilege of distributing trade lists, advertisements or other documents is restricted exclusively to Exhibitors at their respective stands. Placards or advertisements posted without authority will be removed.

No Exhibitor may sublet any space nor move to any other space from that which has been allocated to him or her. Any person infringing regulations without permission in writing of an authorised officer of the Canterbury A&P Association will incur expulsion from the Showgrounds.

Persons in charge of exhibits will be admitted on production of an Exhibitor's pass, and they will be subject to the orders of the Canterbury A&P Committee or its officers.

Should any Exhibitor, in the opinion of the Canterbury A&P Committee, infringe any of these Conditions and Regulations, or refuse to comply with the directions of the Canterbury A&P Committee, or be guilty of any fraudulent or unfair practice or any deceit or concealment either in entering or exhibiting stock, all the exhibits of such Exhibitor shall be disqualified, and his name shall not appear in the Official Prize List, and the Canterbury A&P Committee shall have power to suspend such Exhibitor from exhibiting at any exhibition during such period as it may think fit.

Should any person or firm be disqualified or suspended by a kindred A&P Association registered under "The Agricultural and Pastoral Societies Act, 1908", the A&P Committee of this Canterbury A&P Association shall have power to endorse such disqualification or suspension, and disqualify or suspend such person or firm accordingly.

All exhibits shall be at the sole risk of the owner or Exhibitor, and the Canterbury A&P Association shall not, under any circumstances, be responsible for loss, damage, mis-delivery, detention or delay of exhibits of any description whatever.

The decision of the Canterbury A&P Committee shall be absolutely final in all cases.

The Canterbury A&P Association will endeavour to provide sufficient quantities of green feed to Livestock Exhibitors at the New Zealand Agricultural Show. The Canterbury A&P Association takes no responsibility for providing green feed in excess of what is deemed adequate for each section.

LIMITING OF ENTRIES.

The Canterbury A&P Committee reserves the right to limit entries in any class or section in the event of excessive numbers of animals requiring accommodation.

DISCIPLINE

In addition to any other Judicial Committee under these Rules or any other regulations of the Canterbury A&P Association, there shall be a Judicial Committee comprising the President or a Vice-President and not less than two members of the Canterbury A&P Committee who may consider all complaints, charges or references relating to the conduct or omissions of all Exhibitors.

The Judicial Committee shall have the power to investigate all incidents, acts or omissions which are referred to them, and to obtain such evidence as they may require to hear any complaints, charges or references. Any Exhibitor who is the subject of any complaint, charge or reference to the Judicial Committee shall have the right to be heard by the Judicial Committee in relation to the matter, and such Exhibitor shall, immediately following advice of the complaint, charge or reference, make him/herself available for examination by the Judicial Committee.

The Judicial Committee may, after hearing all evidence which they consider is relevant to any matter referred to them, dismiss the charge, or uphold the charge, and/or censure the Exhibitor, and/or fine the Exhibitor in an amount not exceeding five times the entry fee paid by the Exhibitor to enter the event, and/or ban the Exhibitor from the event, and/or recommend to the General Committee that such Exhibitor be banned from any number of future events or indefinitely.

On a recommendation of the Judicial Committee, the Canterbury A&P General Committee may, in addition to the powers available to the Judicial Committee, ban any Exhibitor from exhibiting in any number of future events or indefinitely.

The decision of the Judicial Committee under Clause 40 above shall be communicated in writing to the Exhibitor forthwith following their decision. The Exhibitor shall have the right to appeal the decision of the Judicial Committee to the General Committee by notice in writing to the President, served within 14 days after the decision of the Judicial Committee. The decision of the General Committee shall be final and binding on the Exhibitor. Any ban shall have effect immediately following the decision of the Judicial Committee. Any fine shall be paid within 30 days of the decision of the Judicial Committee or of the General Committee in the case of appeal and shall constitute a contractual debt and may be recovered by the Association by due process of law as a debt due.

The RAS Yellow Card system now applies across all Livestock and Equestrian sections.

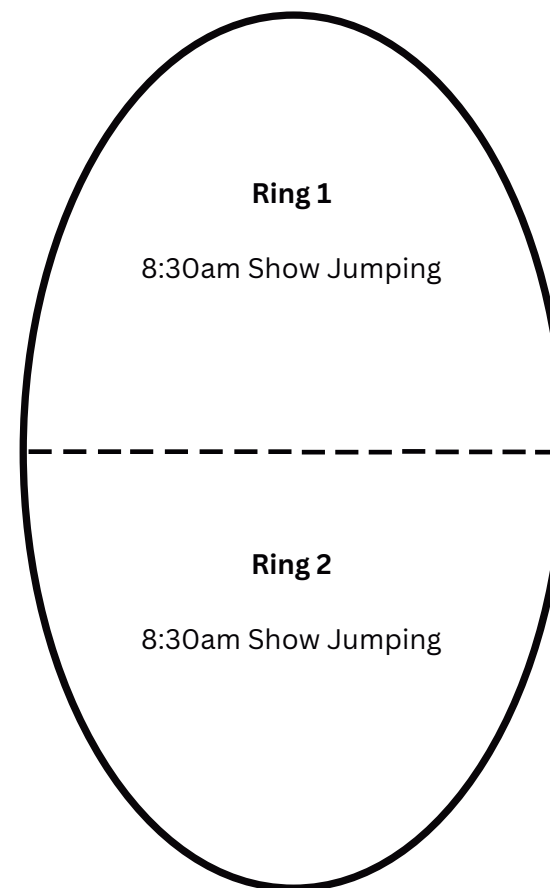

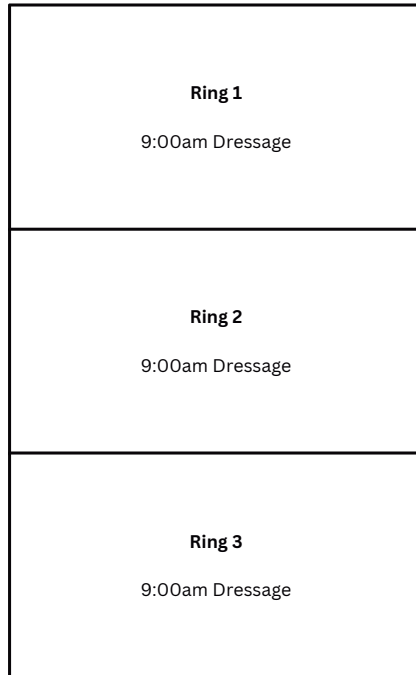

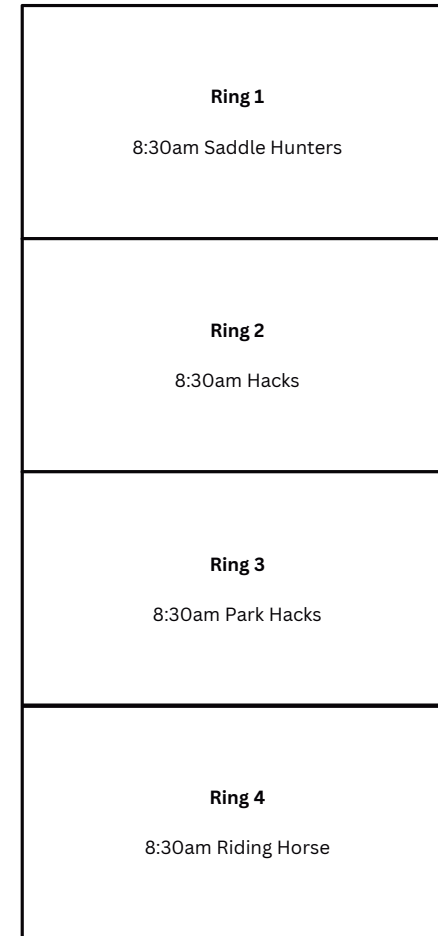

Hunter Jumping & Working Hunters: Back numbers will not be provided for this section.

All Horses/Ponies must have an identification name tag with contact details attached to their halters.

HORSE & PONY ENTRIES CLOSE: MONDAY 14th OCTOBER 2024

CUPS & TROPHIES:

CUPS & TROPHIES AWARDED LAST YEAR TO BE RETURNED BY FRIDAY 20TH SEPTEMBER 2024 TO THE OFFICE AT CANTERBURY AGRICULTURAL PARK IN A CONDITION READY TO RE-PRESENTED THIS YEAR. WE EXPECT THESE TROPHIES TO BE TREATED WITH THE HUGE RESPECT THEY DESERVE.

TIMETABLE:

Exhibitors must know their class numbers and times by checking the timetable and Catalogue that is available on the website www.theshow.co.nz in case of class time changes and be ready to enter the ring before their start time. Classes missed are the exhibitor's responsibility. Late exhibitors will be excluded from the class.

Printed catalogues can be purchased online for \$10.00 or on show day for \$15.00 - please note there will only be a limited number of catalogues available on the day.

If the exhibitor is entered in multiple sections, the exhibitor must decide which class/section to compete in. No class or championship judging will be held up for delayed competitors.

THE COMMITTEE HAS THE RIGHT TO COMBINE CLASSES IF INSUFFICIENT ENTRIES

ENTRY FEES

(Unless otherwise stated): Members \$12, All Non-members \$25 (GST included). Ground Fees: \$8 per horse. All other fees listed on relevant entry forms.

MEMBERSHIP SUBSCRIPTIONS

(GST included): Family, Corporate and Stud Membership \$180, Individual \$90, Junior FREE

NB: To claim membership rates on entry fees, all named parties in a partnership or lease must be members, including Junior riders.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR

RAS Rule GR4 - All riders, including harness drivers with the exclusion of heavy horse (Clydesdale) working classes competing at RAS affiliated A&P Competitions/ Events must wear protective headgear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at more

than two points. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area, collecting rings or anywhere else within the Competition grounds or the grounds of an affiliated Event. Hats/helmets must conform with one of the current approved safety standards and have the yellow tag attached. These standards may be subject to change, but the latest list can be found at www.ras.org.nz. RAS will advise any changes via their website and Facebook. Wearing a hard hat is compulsory for anyone competing on, working in or schooling or riding for any reason a horse at an A&P Competition or in any area considered to be for whatever reason a part of the Competition ground. It is required that all riders, particularly those jumping horses, wear protective headgear conforming to the current NZ Safety Standard or an equivalent standard and that the headgear be secured by a retention harness. (No penalties will be incurred for those riders wishing to use approved safety helmets in competition classes.)

In Turnout and Equitation Classes the rider has a choice to wear a three-point Harness Safety Helmet. The Helmet is to be covered in black velvet with flesh coloured harness. Riders opting to wear a safety riding helmet (as described) will be judged on 'equal terms' as a rider wearing the traditional bowler hat and lanyard. Recommended Helmets: Charles Owen Black - H2000 (6.13KB), Charles Owen Black - H2000 (10.6KB). Dressage competitors please note that under Dressage NZ Rule 415 black or dark blue NZ Safety approved helmets with harness must be worn in all training, warm-ups and competitions.

ENTRIES:

PLEASE NOTE: The Committee has the right to combine and/or delete classes where appropriate due to lack of entries and combine novice classes where there is less than three entries in one class. Any alterations to Classes must be made to the Secretary by 30 October 2024. NO EXCEPTIONS, except Novice upgrading changes see H.9. Any class changes/scratching's etc. during the Competition must be made to the Horse Office, located at the Halswell Pony Clubrooms.

H.1: AGE OF HORSES & PONIES

Age is determined as from 1st August 2024.

Yearling - born since 31st July 2023

2 year old - born since 31st July 2022

3 year old - born since 31st July 2021

4 year old - born since 31st July 2020

H.2: OWNERSHIP & LEASES: RAS Rule ER 8K (2015). All entries must be made in the name of the bona fide owner of the exhibit, and such exhibits must have been the property of the Exhibitor at time of entry. The Association may require evidence of the date of sale of an exhibit. A bona fide owner shall include a PARTNERSHIP or LEASE that has been registered with the Royal Agricultural Society prior to closing of entries. A Lease must be for a term of not less than 6 months and shall commence on receipt of confirmation from the RAS that it has been received.

H.3: The Committee reserves the right to alter conditions, the order of events, or cancel/combine classes, entirely at its own discretion. (If too many entries are received in any Class the Committee may ballot or otherwise reduce the number).

H.4: EQUESTRIAN LEVY: The Royal Agricultural Society of NZ has imposed a levy on each horse and pony entry at the NZ Agricultural Competition for as long as the Canterbury A&P Association is a member of the RAS, which is paid at time of entry and included in the class fee (\$1.25 per class).

REFUNDS OF ENTRY FEES:

H5: The Canterbury A&P Association will refund 70% of the entry fees upon receipt of a Medical or Veterinary Certificate. These must be received by the Show Secretary within 14 days of the Show.

QUALIFICATION: Qualifications are not required for this event 2024.

NOVICE SECTION

H.9: Snaffle bits to be worn in all Novice classes.

Please note that a record of wins will be asked for. RAS Horse/Pony Certificates must be carried. Failure to do so will result in elimination.

All wins in Novice Sections (excluding breed sections) within each division count and must be recorded. Should a Novice horse win an open conformation class, these wins must also be recorded. Once a horse has achieved 6 wins in either the conformation classes or paced and mannered classes, this horse is not eligible to return to Novice status should it change Sections at the beginning of a new Competition season - excludes Lead Rein, First Ridden and Breed section wins.

A Novice is a Horse or Pony which has not won 6 firsts in conformation classes at any A&P Competition, at the time of the Competition.

Once a Horse or Pony has had 6 wins it is not eligible for Novice Classes. Number of wins is to be counted at time of Competition not time of entry.

If a Novice entry has gained 6 wins by the day of the Competition, the competitor must advise the Secretary's office and may change to an Open class within the Sub-Section, or if no class remains to enter, a refund will be actioned after the Competition.

A Novice in Paced and Mannered classes is a Horse or Pony which has not won 6 firsts in Paced and/ or Mannered classes at an A&P Competition at the time of the Competition.

Novice Champions are not eligible for Open Championships unless they have won their Open Class, nor are they eligible for Supreme Award. Championship award does not count as a win.

Novices may enter Open Classes.

Novice ponies may be ridden by riders of any age in Novice Classes only but not in Open Section where the stated age applies.

All A&P Competition/Event results are collated at the Royal Agricultural Society Head Office to enable Secretaries to keep a record of all novice wins.

SUBSTITUTIONS

H.12: A Vet Certificate must be produced to the Secretary for any horse or pony being substituted. The substitution is required to meet qualification stipulations and must be owned by the exhibitor in accordance with Condition H.2.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

H.13: It is an offence for any electronic or audio equipment to be carried on a competitor in the competition ring, deemed to be possible of outside assistance to a competitor. Penalties may include forfeiting all prize money, awards and qualifications and elimination from any further classes at that Competition.

DISABLED EXHIBITORS

Those exhibitors requiring an aid for assistance during competition may apply to the Royal Agricultural Society for an identification card. RAS, PO Box 44, Oxford 7430, telephone 022 567 7551. Disabled competitors are welcome at the Competition, however if you are on crutches or in a wheelchair or disabled in a way that limits your ability to control a horse the Canterbury A&P Association Horse Committee requires a plan to manage your horse to be received before 1st of October 2024 for review and approval. The purpose of this is to ensure the safety of all competitors and volunteers in the ring. The committee's decision will be final and binding.

CLEAN SPORT TESTING

H.14: The use of tranquilizers, stimulants, or any substance which affects the performance of horses or ponies is forbidden.

H.15: Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Competition. Testing of all animals will be at the owner's risk and will be carried out under CS procedures - RAS Equestrian Rules CS7

H.16A: Your signature on the Summary of Entry form, and/or participation in competition, denotes acceptance of these conditions. - RAS Equestrian Rules for Affiliated

Competitions/Events, Competitors and Judges; CS Clean Sport.

JUDGING AND PRESENTATION OF EXHIBITS

H.17: Competitors must have their entries ready for judging at the times stated, or they will be liable to disqualification.

H.18: No distinguishing mark of ownership or stud name, with the exception of registered brands, may be attached to the animal exhibited or the handler.

H.19: No competitor, exhibitor or member of their family shall approach a judge with regard to a decision unless they first obtain the permission of the Competition

Convenor/Manager/Ring Master or Ring Steward the most senior of whom shall carry the decision on the day.

IN HAND HORSES & PONIES

H.20: In Led Classes breeding must be shown on the Entry Form.

H.21: Horses must be presented for judging in the required manner.

H.22: For In Hand classes all stock to be led clockwise with the attendant on the near side. Attendants are requested to be suitably attired when parading horses in the ring.

H.23: No-one under the age of 16 can lead a large animal.

STALLIONS

H.24: All stallions when being led should be controlled by a colt bit with a single lead or a chain over the nose attached to a single lead, with the exception of foals, Miniature horses and Shetland pony yearlings. Stallions must be kept in their stables/horse box or approved suitable yards when not competing. Stallions must not be tied up unattended unless in an appropriate confinement.

H.24A STALLION IDENTIFICATION

It is compulsory for all stallions and colts except foals to wear two (2) Official identification 'S' badges; one on each side of the bridle. Riders/Handlers - must wear two (2) Official Stallion ID Arm Bands; one on each arm. The Rider/Handler and the attendant(s) must wear an Official ID 'S' Bib at all times outside the showing ring. This includes Shetland's.

H.25: WARM UP AREA

In a warm up area a stallion must be accompanied by at least one attendant, in addition to the Rider/Handler at all times. Official sets of 'S' badges and Arm Bands are available from ESNZ.

H.25B: A marshal or steward has the right to order any stallion/colt considered to be out of control or to be causing disquiet to other horses from the Ring/Marshalling area without recourse from the stallion/colts owner/exhibitor/competitor.

SADDLE HORSES & PONIES

H.26: No horse or pony under 4 years of age is permitted to be shown under saddle.

H.26A: Horses/Ponies may only compete in the Section nominated on their RAS certificate.

H.27: At no time may horses or ponies be ridden outside the designated areas.

H.28: No change of rider will be allowed in any horse or pony classes after entering the ring for that class, except in exceptional cases when consent of the Judge or Chief Marshall must be obtained.

H.29: A horse or pony being eligible for a Championship must be ridden by the same rider as in the class or classes in which it qualified unless the permission of the Chief Horse Steward has been obtained. In the case of a rider qualifying more than one pony, a second rider may be found.

H.30: The age of the rider is taken as at 1st August this year. Riders on open ponies are to be under 17 years of age.

H.31: Judges are directed to award prizes only to Horses which they consider free from hereditary unsoundness.

H.32: Classes where the sex is not specified are open only to Mares, Fillies or Geldings unless otherwise stated.

In all Classes LATE COMERS will not be accepted into the Ring for judging.

HUNTER JUMPING

The Ringmaster and the Convenor have the authority to refuse a competitor on the day if that combination is considered at risk of mishap if allowed to compete.

H.33: In all Hunting events one baulk will disqualify.

H.34: A saddle must be provided for each horse, so that there may be no delay in starting.

H.35: Hunters must be ready to start when called and must run in catalogue order, unless by permission of the Chief Steward.

H.36: It shall be a direction to the Judge that in all Hunting events, style and manners are to be taken into consideration.

H.37: To competition that they have their mounts under control, competitors in all Hunting events must at the conclusion of their round, pull up and face the Judge. Points will be scored for manners.

SHOWJUMPING & DRESSAGE

H.38: ESNZ Competitions: To be eligible, competitors and horses must be registered.

Marking will be according to the official rules of the Equestrian Sport NZ. ESNZ Identification Numbers must be worn. Showjumping and dressage entries close Monday 14 October 2024. See Conditions in front of showjumping and Dressage Sections.

MEASURING: Fees for Measuring, Life & Replacement Certificates

(a) The following charges, inclusive of GST, shall apply nationwide for the measuring service however individual stands are entitled to charge additional operating costs. First Measure (either annual or youngstock) with issue of certificate - \$40.00, Annual re-measure \$25.00, Young stock re-measure \$15.00, Life Certificate \$100.00 The fees will be split with 70% remaining with the measuring stand and 30% going to the RAS Head Office.

(a) Replacement Certificate \$100.00

All replacement certificates (lost certificates, change of horse/pony name etc.) must be issued from the RAS Head Office. The person seeking the replacement certificate must apply to the RAS Head Office for their replacement certificate and have received that certificate before taking the animal to the measuring stand for ongoing measured. Any replacement certificates issued directly from the measuring stand will be invalid. Cost for a replacement certificate may be reduced at the discretion of the RAS Head Office. The classification (section nominated) of a horse or pony must be made at the time of its adult measure or from the 1 August 2024 at the time the horse/pony is first registered prior to its first Measure (whichever occurred first) however, a change to this classification (section nominated) (with the exceptions listed in rule CDE 1 d) may be made by making application to RAS Head Office (download the application from the website www.ras.org.nz). Any subsequent changes will require a full submission with the final decision on granting further changes resting with the RAS Horse Stewards Council Executive.

H.39: There will be no measuring during the Competition. The Canterbury A&P Association

measurer cannot take responsibility if a horse is not measured before Competition. All stock to be measured must be measured prior to 31 October and class changes notified immediately. The onus is on the exhibitor to enter the correct class.

H.40: Where height is a requirement of the Section, exhibitors must carry an official RAS Horse/Pony Certificate, failure to do so will result in elimination.

H.41: Young stock, under 3 years, must have an RAS Horse/Pony Certificate dated no earlier than 1 August this year, which is eligible until 31st January. RAS Horse/Pony Certificates are only required where height is a requirement of the section.

H.42: All stock presented for measuring must be in a bridle or bit suitable for control.

H.43: Horses and Ponies must be measured by an Official Measurer and his decision shall be final. When shod, 0.5cm thickness of shoes allowed.

H.44: Young stock certificates issued by any Official RAS Measuring stand and issued by an official RAS Measurer in the current spring season will be accepted.

H.46 Applications for a special measuring should be made by prior arrangement only with Stuart Schroder Ph 03 322 7236. An extra charge of \$10 will apply. Measuring stand will be open on WEDNESDAY 13 NOVEMBER 4-7 PM.

HORSEBOXES

H.47: Parking is available on a daily basis for local exhibitors' trucks and cars with floats, with horses being able to be tied to floats in the designated area excluding Stallions (refer to H.24). NB: Yards are available; no temporary yards are allowed to be erected. ESNZ approved yards that attach to trucks may be allowed if written request is received by the Committee.

H.48: Applications must be made at time of entry via www.showday.online/shows/newzealand/south-island Applications must also be received at the normal closing date of 14th October 2024 from showjumping and dressage competitors.

H.49: Application must be restricted to a box for each horse exhibited. Boxes are not to be used for storing gear, feed etc. If a horse/pony is scratched the exhibitor must notify the horse box supervisor for the box to be reallocated.

H.50: Preference for boxes is given to Stallions, Colts, Brood Mares with Foals, Young stock, and exhibitors from a distance. DUE TO HIGH DEMAND PREFERENCE IS ALSO GIVEN ON DATE ORDER OF ENTRY AND BOX REQUEST RECEIVED I.E. ON A FIRST IN FIRST SERVED BASIS. Miniature stallions from a distance will receive consideration in box allocation for Option B (horse box form). Donkeys will not be allocated boxes. Stallion boxes must have sign denoting "STALLION" on outside of box. If a stallion cannot be stabled next to any other horses the onus is on the competitor to book and pay for two stables.

H.51: Exhibitors tying horses in alleyways of the Stable Complex will be liable to disqualification and asked to remove their horses from the showgrounds.

H.52: The Association does not guarantee to provide horse accommodation as the number of boxes is limited. Exhibitors who are not allocated a box may obtain a refund on application to the Horse Office.

H.53: Boxes allocated to led stock, must be vacated and left clean by 6.00pm on the first day so that they can be reallocated to Exhibitors in other classes. Wet and dirty sawdust/hay must be removed on vacating box. It is the Exhibitor's responsibility to keep boxes and the area outside boxes clean and tidy. Exhibitors are asked to notify the steward at the Horse Office located next to the stables if box is not clean. Exhibitors WILL BE FINED at the cost of full hire incurred if stables are not left clean. No manure/hay to be left in the aisles or end of the stables, must go over on the muck heap.

SMOKING IN HORSEBOXES IS PROHIBITED

H.54: 1. Smoking is prohibited in and around the stable blocks. 2. Any person found smoking in or around the vicinity of the Horseboxes will be fined \$1000.

PUBLIC ENTER STABLES AT THEIR OWN RISK.

UNLOADING OF HORSES AND VEHICLE PARKING

H.55: Exhibitors who have booked a stable/yard are to enter off the Motorway through Curletts Road Entrance to designated unloading and parking areas. All other exhibitors enter off McMahon Drive to designated parking areas. Vehicles must have appropriate windscreen passes in place PRIOR to arrival or vehicles will be turned away. Parked vehicles will be policed for windscreen passes and those not displaying correct passes will be towed away without warning. Exhibitors must remove floats from unloading area beside horse boxes immediately after unloading is completed. Camping in horse trucks is available at a fee of \$40 and is to remain in horse float parking area where showers and toilets will be provided.

AWARD OF CHAMPIONSHIPS

H.59: Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected as follows: First Prize winners in all eligible classes to be paraded before the Judge. Immediately after the Champion has been selected, the Second Prize animal from the class the Champion came from shall parade with the others for Reserve Champion.

H.60: Championships will only be awarded where there are at least 3 exhibitors, unless in the opinion of the Judge, an animal is deemed worthy of the award.

H.62: Sponsorship of a section or a class may be paid in lieu of Association's prize money and will not be additional. Sponsorships are subject to confirmation. Product made available by sponsors may substitute for cash prizes.

H.63: Showing Section: Breastplate numbers (black on white or white on black only) only at this Competition.

RTR Hunters & Working Hunters: Back numbers will not be provided for this section. Back numbers available from: Finishing Touch Equestrian sales@fte.co.nz

H.65: HORSE SECRETARY'S OFFICE: Please make any scratchings or class alterations during the Competition directly to the Horse Office, which is located in the Halswell Pony Club rooms.

H.66: No competitor or exhibitor or member of their family shall approach a Judge with regard to a decision unless they first obtain the permission of the Competition Convenor/Manager/Ring Master or Ring Steward the most senior of whom shall carry the decision on the day.

H.67: NO DOGS are permitted on the grounds.
